



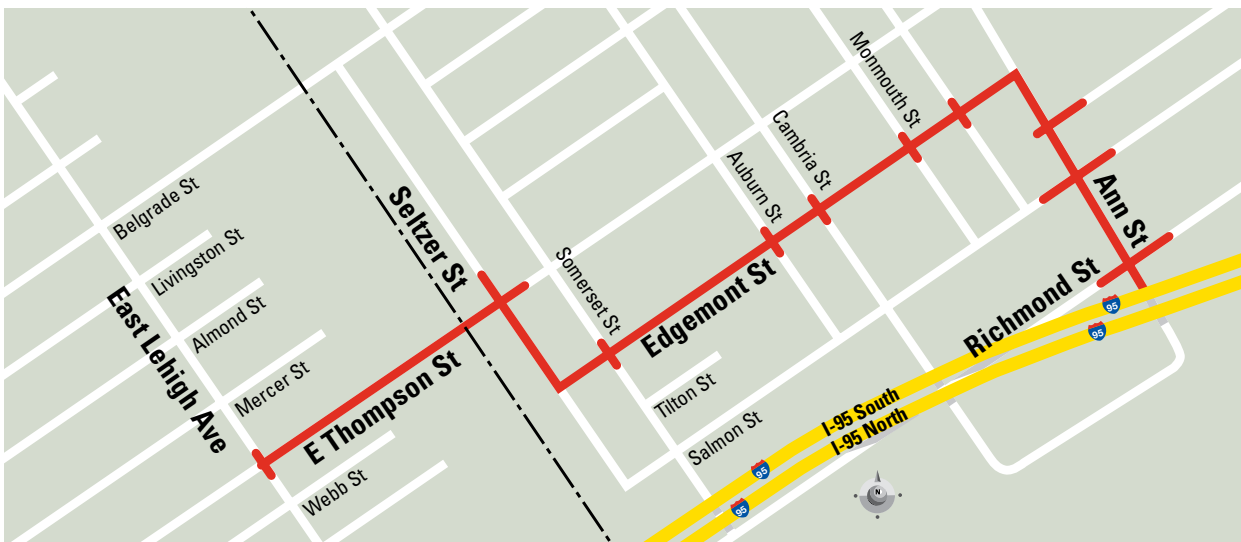

Girard Avenue Interchange

New Utility Installations in Your Neighborhood

Construction will begin shortly to place new gas and water mains under your street as part of the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation's I-95/Girard Avenue Interchange Improvement Project (I-95/GIR).



As shown on the map above, the utility work will take place on a two-block section of Ann Street and on Edgemont, Seltzer and Thompson streets between Ann Street and Lehigh Avenue.

- Gas line work will start on Ann Street at Richmond Street and progress along the outlined route, finishing at Lehigh Avenue at Thompson Street.
- Concurrent water line work will begin at Lehigh Avenue and Thompson Street and progress along the outlined route, finishing at Ann and Richmond streets.
- Water and gas line work will proceed block-by-block, with affected streets closed to through traffic during active construction. Residents in work areas will continue to have access. Open trenches will be covered and the streets reopened at the end of each day.
- Normal working hours are Monday through Friday between 7:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. Some overtime and weekend work also may be required.
- Accommodations will be made for emergency access and pedestrians. Continue to place trash at the curb as regularly scheduled.
- Short-term parking restrictions will be in place in each construction area. Temporary "No Parking" signs will be posted where and when necessary.

Additional Information

- Water and gas line installations are expected to be completed in approximately 10 months.
- This type of construction is noisy and involves the use of large trucks and other heavy equipment. Every attempt will be made to complete this work at minimal inconvenience to you and your neighbors.
- The contractor will replace existing water service pipes between the new water main and the curb valve box at each building. Streets and sidewalks will be restored to the general condition at the time of construction.
- Short-term service disruptions will be required when new lines are connected to your building. You will be notified one day in advance of any planned disruptions.
- It will be necessary to temporarily store construction materials in selected areas within the work zone.

Construction inspectors will be on site during all activities and will be available to speak with residents about problems or concerns related to the work.

The project will be staffed by PennDOT or Philadelphia Water Department contractors and all work will be completed within the public right-of-way. No project personnel will require access to private property unless the property owner is notified in advance in writing by PennDOT or its assigned agent.
